The planned activities are:

- Commemoration of the 28<sup>th</sup> February Crossroad Shooting Incident on Friday, **February 28, 2025.**
- Finals of a nationwide school quiz competition on Sunday **March 02, 2025.**
- Finals of a nationwide debate competition on Tuesday **March 04, 2025.**
- President's school children awards programme **on Wednesday March 05, 2025.**
- Ceremonial parade at the forecourt of the Presidency on Thursday **March 06, 2025.**

Beginning this week, the Communications Subcommittee of the NCPC will roll-out an information and educational content for television, radio and social media, ahead of the February 28 Wreath Laying Ceremony.
